The Howard School celebrates a monumental Ofsted result, having secured the first 'Exceptional' criteria grading for a secondary school in Kent.

This result comes amidst an overwhelmingly positive Ofsted inspection, which also sees the school receiving four 'Strong Standard' and two 'Expected Standard' judgements.

Inspectors judged Personal Development and Wellbeing to be 'Exceptional', a grade reserved for practice that is among the very best in the country. Inspectors found that the school's work to support pupils' mental health, character, and spiritual growth has a "transformational" impact, particularly for its most vulnerable learners.

Achievement and Post-16 were also found to meet the 'Expected Standard', with "overall progress which [is] above national averages over time". The Sixth Form curriculum, it was noted, is "designed to meet students' needs", with "expert career guidance" which allows students to go onto "highly aspirational higher education and apprenticeships".

Speaking of the school's success, Mr Johal, Principal of The Howard School, said:

"We are absolutely thrilled with the fantastic things that Ofsted said about our school, and the parental and carer feedback given to Ofsted via the Ofsted questionnaire. Ofsted commented that they had rarely seen such positive feedback from parents and careers."

Owen McColgan, Chief Executive of THAT, also celebrated the school's achievements:

"We are incredibly proud that the school received an Exceptional grade for Personal Development and Wellbeing. Ofsted has made it clear that Exceptional practice represents provision that is among the very best nationally and from which other schools can learn. This outcome is thoroughly deserved and is a testament to the dedication of staff, leaders and governors who work tirelessly to provide the very best for pupils."

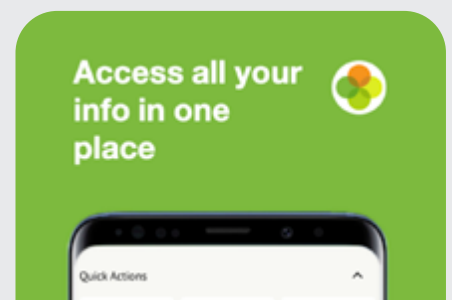
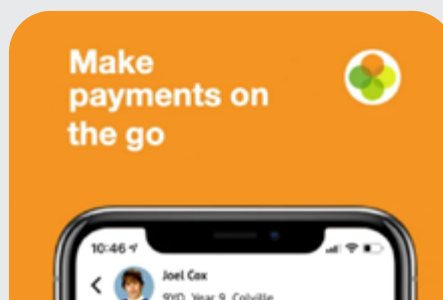
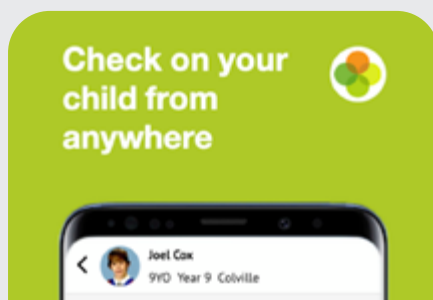

Year 9 Visit the Natural History Museum

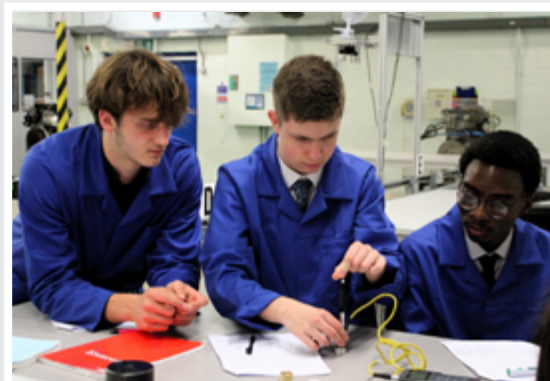
Our Year 9 students enjoyed a fantastic Enrichment Day at the Natural History Museum, exploring its world-famous collections.

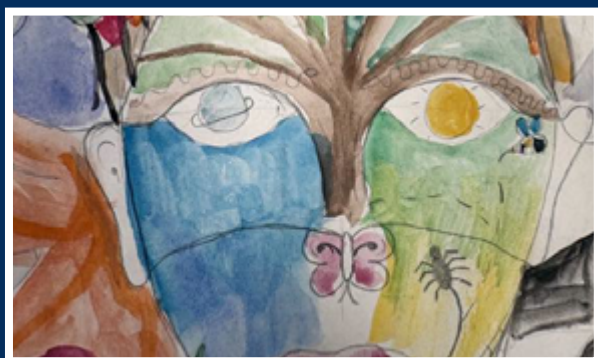
Year 9 Duke of Edinburgh Bronze Expedition

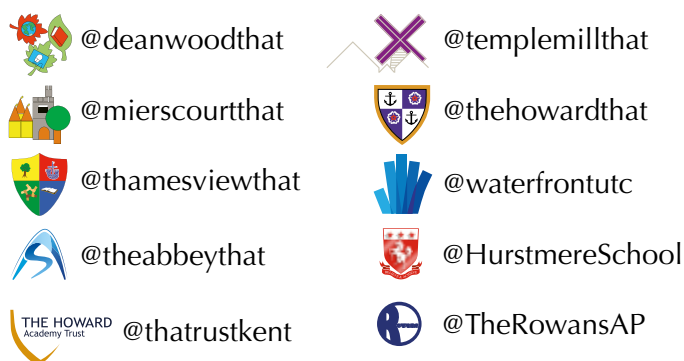
